

The Cryosphere (TC) introduces full Service Charges

Due to the tremendous efforts of the editorial board, the high quality of the submitted papers as well as the continuous support by referees, authors and the scientific community, TC was indexed in 2010 in Thomson Reuter's Science Citation Index Expanded (SCIE) including the Web of Science. In 2011 we received the first journal impact factor for 2010 with an amount of 3.641.

Following this milestone in the establishment of the journal in the scientific publication market TC introduces full service charges to be paid by the authors (or their institution) to cover the costs of the review process, typesetting, web publication and long term archiving. So far, the charges were reduced in categories 1 and 2.
